10:00 am | Santa Fe Depot & Visitor Center

Go on a Guided Tour of our Atchison County Historical Museum. Also feel free to pick up our Visitors Guide, Events Guide or our Shopping/Dining Map as you browse through our Warming Hut Gift Shop.

10:45 am | Evah C. Cray Historic Home

Step back in time and tour this impressive three-story Victorian mansion inspired by Scottish castles. Be sure to visit their Carriage-House Gift Shop. Guided tour is \$5 per person.

12:00 pm | Lunch

Our Tourism Coordinator would be happy to assist you in selecting the perfect restaurants for your tour.

1:00 pm | Shopping on Atchison's Commercial Street Mall

Stroll down the beautifully landscaped outdoor pedestrian mall and enjoy the unique collection of locally owned shops.

3:00 pm | Amelia Earhart's Birthplace Museum

Take a self-guided tour through the historic home where Amelia Earhart spent her childhood. Amelia Earhart was born on July 24, 1897 in this home, built by her grandfather in the early 1860's. It is now owned and operated as a museum by The Ninety-Nines Inc., an international organization of women pilots. \$6 per person; the museum generally takes about 45 minutes to go through.

4:00 pm | Historic Trolley Tour

The Atchison area has many sites to view on the National Register of Historical places. Take an hour-long trolley ride. Adults \$6 and Children (4-10) \$2 per person.

5:00 pm | Check into Hotel or Bed & Breakfast

There several hotels to choose from—our Tourism Coordinator can help you find the right one, or you can reference our Shopping/Dining Map.

6:00 pm | Dinner

7:00 pm | Stroll Along the Scenic Riverwalk

Learn about the adventures of Lewis and Clark at the Pavilion. Then head out to Independence Creek at the Lewis and Clark Historic Site. Also explore a recreated Kanza Indian dwelling near the July 4, 1804 Corps of Discovery Campsite.

8:30 am | Breakfast

10:00 am | Mount St. Scholastica, Convent of the Benedictine Sisters

Visit a monastery, built in 1863. Go on a guided tour of a chapel with ornately carved choir stalls and windows depicting St. Benedict's life, and a larger Romanesque chapel with stained glass windows and a 2000-pipe organ as well as a religious history room. *Charge of \$5 per person.*

11:00 am | International Forest of Friendship & Amelia Earhart Earthwork

The Ninety-Nines Inc. also established the Forest of Friendship. An array of trees has been brought in from all over the world. The Earthwork, a one-acre portrait of Amelia Earhart, is the first permanent crop artwork created by artist Stan Herd. These are both located at Warnock Lake; no charge for either attraction.

10:00 am | Cemetery Walking Tour or Step-On Guided Tour | \$16pp

As one of Atchison's most picturesque and oldest cemeteries, Mount Vernon contains impressive monuments to those who built Atchison into a thriving commercial river town. Other features include presentations of funeral and mourning customs and defining the symbols that were etched into grave markers

HISTORY-THEMED TOUR

Take in the wonderful and intriguing history of Atchison KS, and be sure to include the following destinations and activities:

Historic Trolley Tour or Tour Bus Step-On

There's no better way to experience the charms of Atchison than by having a personally-guided tour past our historic sites. Hop aboard the trolley at the Visitors Center in the restored Santa Fe Depot and enjoy a 45-minute tour of Atchison, narrated by a friendly, knowledgeable driver. As the trolley travels along the city's brick streets, you'll discover the city's classic charm—its Victorian homes, sites significant in state and national history, and dramatic views of the Missouri River. *GENERAL ADMISSION FARES: Adults – \$6, Children (4-10 years) – \$2, Children under 4 – Free. HOURS: The trolley departs each hour, on the hour from the Santa Fe Depot, 200 South Tenth. HOURS VARY BY MONTH AND SEASON. CALL (800) 234-1854 for times or to schedule a Charter or Step-On Tour.*

Atchison County Historical Society Museum

This museum in the restored Santa Fe Depot traces the history of the region. Exhibits highlight Atchison's transition from a bend in the Missouri River to a busy commercial center for steamboats, westward-bound wagon trains and the railroads. Highlights include a display of Amelia Earhart's personal effects, a large collection of rare guns dating back to the Revolutionary War and displays on the Lewis & Clark expedition. Open daily. Atchison Rail Museum

Adjacent to the Santa Fe Depot, the Atchison Rail Museum is owned and operated by the North East Kansas Railroaders, Inc., a voluntary group of railroad enthusiasts. It features an outdoor collection of rail cars and is available for exterior viewing throughout the year. NEKR members operate the Atchison & Western Miniature Railroad, a 12" gauge railroad, weekends during the summer, Sat. 10-5, Sun. 12-4. Museum cars open summer weekends.

Commercial Street Pedestrian Mall

In 1958, Atchison, Kansas became the first American city to adopt a pedestrian mall for its downtown area, closing three blocks of Commercial Street to automobile traffic after a flood devastated the

downtown area. Today, the Commercial Street Mall still boasts an exciting array of specialty shops and dining establishments. You will want to carve out ample time to shop and explore on America's first pedestrian mall.

Evah C. Cray Historical Home Museum

Recently renovated and updated, this 25-room mansion is a glorious example of the opulence of the Victorian era. Built in 1882, it is distinguished by a three-story castle-like tower. Ornate fireplaces, carved woodwork and original chandeliers mix with Victorian furnishings. The carriage house features a gift store and a small theatre in which a film on the architecture of Atchison can be viewed. *Admission: \$5.00/person. Hours of operation: In April, open Fri, Sat, Sun and Mon only. May – Oct., open daily; 10am-4pm Mon-Sat; 1-4pm Sun. Closed from Oct. 31 to Saturday after Thanksgiving to decorate for Christmas. Then open Fri, Sat, Sun and Mon through Dec. 17. Closed for the winter months.*

Muchnic Art Gallery

Parquet floors, stained-glass windows, hand-tooled leather and finely-carved woodwork make an impressive backdrop for displays of art by regional and national artists. A lumber merchant built this spectacular Queen Anne-style mansion in 1887 – 1888. The Muchnic family bequeathed the home to the community to be used for art purposes. The first floor is furnished, as it was when the Muchnics lived here in the early 1900s. Art exhibits are displayed on the second floor from March through December. Open afternoons on Wednesday, Saturday & Sunday; closed January – March. Minimal fee.

Amelia Earhart Birthplace Museum

On July 24, 1897, aviatrix Amelia Earhart was born in this home, built by her grandfather in the early 1860s. It is owned and operated as a museum by The Ninety-Nines Inc., an international organization of women pilots. Earhart helped found the group in 1929 and served as its first president. Recent renovations have returned the birthplace to its condition at the turn of the century when Earhart lived here with her grandparents. Cost: \$6 adults, \$1 children 12 & under. Regular hours (Feb. -Nov.): 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. M-F; 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. Sat.; 1-4 p.m. Sun. Winter hours (Dec.- Jan): Closed M-Tues.; 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. W-F; 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. Sat.; 1-4 p.m. Sun.

Mount Vernon Cemetery

Many prominent early-day Kansans are buried in this hilltop cemetery — three Kansas governors, Senator John J. Ingalls, two pony express riders, legendary train engineer Brit Craft and both sets of Amelia Earhart's grandparents.

2 miles south of Atchison via Price Boulevard and Rawlins Road.

Mount St. Scholastica

The Benedictine Sisters of Mount St. Scholastica have been in Atchison since 1863. St. Scholastica Chapel is rich with beautiful marble, a large rose window and stained-glass windows honoring seven martyred women saints. A vaulted ceiling graces the interior of the choir chapel, which has facing choir stalls and stained-glass windows retelling the life of St. Benedict. Guided tours of the chapels and a religious history room by advanced appointment.

Amelia Earhart Earthwork

This one-acre portrait was created by famed Kansas artist Stan Herd in 1997. It lies on a hillside overlooking Warnock Lake and is composed of permanent plantings, stone and other natural materials. A viewing deck on a nearby hilltop provides the best ground views of the earthwork.

International Forest of Friendship

A life-size bronze statue of Amelia Earhart gazes over the International Forest of Friendship, which is a living, growing memorial to those who have been involved in aviation and space exploration. The forest was established as a bicentennial project by the City of Atchison and The Ninety-Nines Inc., an international organization of women pilots. Each June, new honorees are inducted into the forest with plaques embedded in the walkway that winds through trees representing all 50 states and over 35 countries in which forest honorees reside. Several special trees include the "Moon Tree," which was grown from a seed taken to the moon aboard Apollo 14. It is encircled by the Astronaut's Memorial, which honors ten astronauts who lost their lives in space exploration.

Benedictine College

Benedictine is a four-year, Catholic, co-educational and residential liberal arts college on 100 acres overlooking the Missouri River. Freshman Hall, built in 1892 and the school's first residential building, is a notable landmark.

St. Benedict's Abbey

Benedictine monks established St. Benedict's Abbey in the late 1850s. About 40 monks reside at the abbey, which was completed in 1929. The church was designed by a student of Frank Lloyd Wright and was completed in 1957. It features a 44-foot-high nave ceiling, facing choir stalls where monks gather three times a day for common prayer and unique frescoes. Self-guided tours.

St. Pat's Church

The state's oldest church in the Archdiocese of Kansas City still in continuous use. It was added to the National Register in 1998. *Eight miles south on Kansas Highway 73 (west on 234th Road).*

Mormon Grove

An historic marker commemorates the site where some 20,000 Mormons camped before moving on to their "promised land." *3 miles west of Atchison on U.S. Highway 73.*

Lewis & Clark Pavilion

The Lewis & Clark Pavilion in Riverfront Park was constructed in preparation for the Lewis and Clark bicentennial commemoration on July 3-4, 2004. The pavilion, built by the Kansas Lewis & Clark Bicentennial Commission, contains an interactive touchscreen monitor and interpretive panels with

information on the Lewis & Clark expedition, the Missouri River and the Kanza Nation.

Lewis and Clark Interpretive Signs

The Kansas Lewis and Clark Bicentennial Commission erected a series of interpretive signs along the Lewis and Clark Trail between Kansas City and White Cloud, Kansas. Five of those signs are in the Atchison area.

Pony Express Memorial

A granite marker at 3rd and Main streets commemorates the Pony Express which, in its last months of operation, originated from Atchison.

Victorian Architecture

Atchison boasts one of the most impressive collections of Victorian architecture in the Midwest. The greatest concentration of well-preserved homes is north of the downtown along 3rd, 4th and 5th streets. Dozens of other fine homes are interspersed throughout town. The city has over 20 properties on the National Register of Historic Places.

Veterans War Memorial

Take special note of the Veterans Memorial at Riverfront Park, where the names of area military veterans are proudly displayed. The latest addition to the park is a relic display, an artifact from the historic USS Arizona, which was sunk in the attack on Pearl Harbor.

Theatre Atchison

Theatre Atchison, located inside one of Atchison's most historic buildings, presents award winning live community theatre throughout the year. Fri & Sat shows 8pm; Sun shows 2pm. Citadel Caverns is located in Atchison, Kansas on 125 acres of land that was previously a secure military storage facility owned by the U.S. Army. Independence Creek Hiking/Biking Trail

This ten-mile hiking/biking trail connects downtown Atchison with Independence Creek and the historic area where the Lewis and Clark expedition camped on July 4, 1804. The trail head includes a recreated Kanza Indian lodge that is free to view. The Kanza lodge, trail and Lewis & Clark attractions on the Atchison Riverfront were named one of the 8 Wonders of Kansas History in 2010.

Riverfront Park

Riverfront Park was dedicated on Jun 19, 2004, after many years of planning. It features the Lewis & Clark Pavilion, Veterans' Memorial Plaza, a hiking/biking path along the river, enhanced boat access with a river overlook area, children's play area with a keelboat replica play structure, and new bathrooms. If you're a walker or bicyclist, you can begin a ten-mile journey from the south end of the riverfront. Jackson Park

Jackson Park, Atchison's largest, is just one of our beautiful city parks that give both residents and tourists alike the opportunity to pursue healthy activities. Jackson Park is a heavily wooded area with trails, play equipment, a shelter house and picnicking.

Atchison State Fishing: Located about 3 miles North of Atchison on Hwy. 7. No charge for camping. Drinking water available, no electricity. New cabin now available for rent. Cabin sleeps a maximum of 6. \$71 first night; \$60 each additional. Kitchen utensils provided; bed & bath linens NOT provided. Reservations must be made only online at www.kdwp.state.ks.us.
