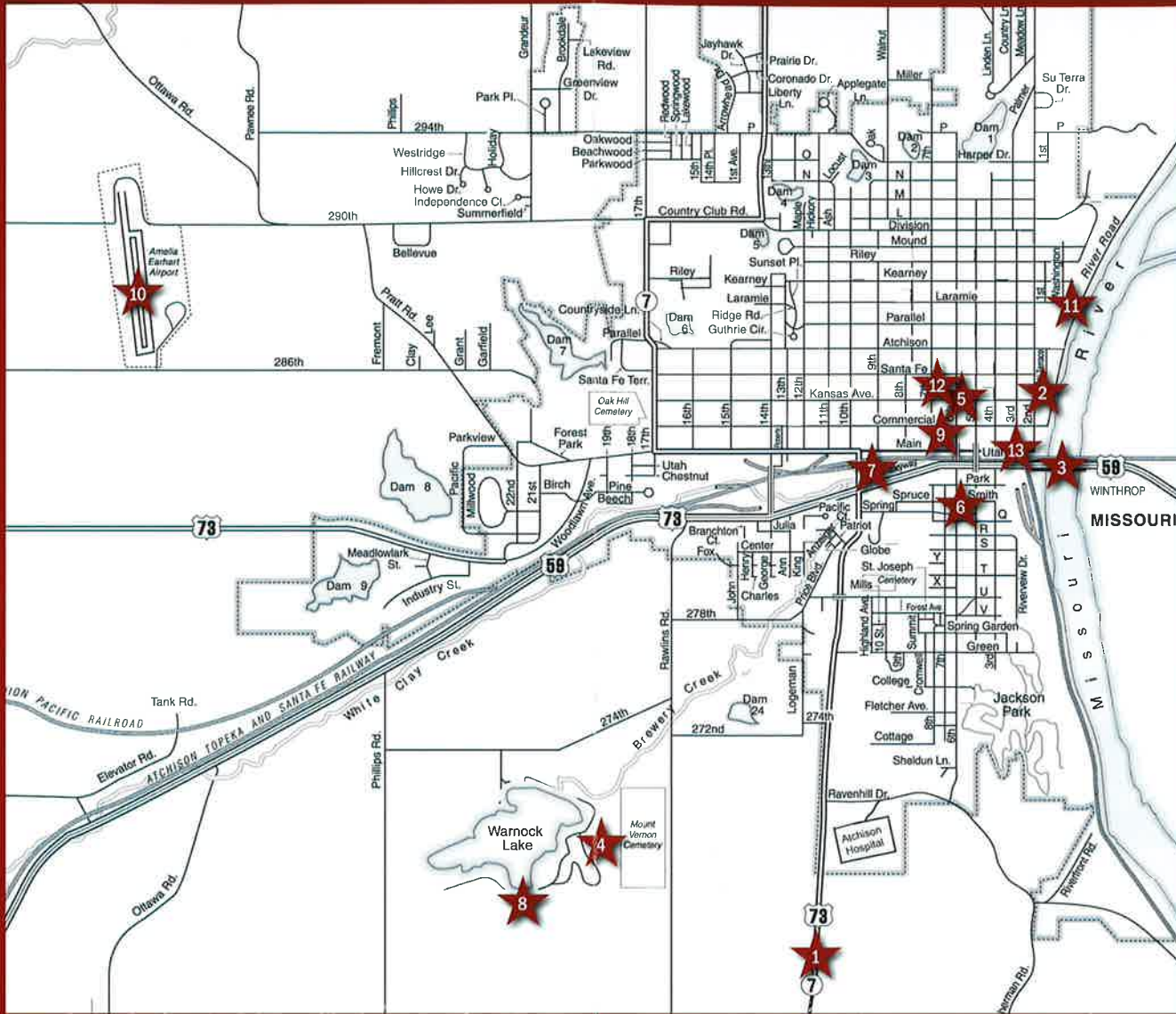

1 "Amelia Comes Home"



Located south of the city limits on the East side of US Hwy 73. This Highway Artwork was a gift to the Atchison Community from artist John Cerney in 2012.

2 Amelia Earhart Birthplace Museum



223 N. Terrace – The Birthplace Museum is a National Historic Site that attracts thousands of visitors a year.

3 Amelia Earhart Bridge



This network tied arch bridge over the Missouri River on US Route 59 was opened to traffic in December 2012 after replacing a previous truss bridge built in 1939.

4 Amelia Earhart Earthwork



A one-acre 'portrait' created by Kansas artist Stan Herd in 1997, which lies on a hillside overlooking Warnock Lake.

5 Amelia Earhart Post Office



621 Kansas Ave. – Recently renamed the Amelia Earhart Post Office by U.S. Congress.

6 Amelia Earhart Substation



Between South 4th and 5th streets, this substation was built by Westar to improve the reliability of the electrical grid in Atchison.

7 Atchison County Historical Society



200 S. 10th St. – One of the largest collections of Amelia Earhart Artifacts on display.

8 International Forest of Friendship



Located at Warnock Lake, the Forest of Friendship is a living, growing memorial to the world history of aviation and aerospace.

9 Mall Statue



601 Commercial St. – Bronze statue of Amelia Earhart.

10 Muriel



Located at the Amelia Earhart Airport, 16701 286th Road, Muriel is the last original 1935 Lockheed Electra L-10E in the world. Available by appointment. (913) 367-2427

11 River Front



A beautiful fireworks show can be seen on the river front during the Annual Amelia Earhart Festival in July.

12 Selfie Mural



700 Block of Kansas Ave. – Amelia Earhart themed mural created by Benedictine College students, Lauren Hart and Tori Sanders.
