



AMELIA EARHART MUSEUMS in Atchison

Tour the historic house built in 1861 where Amelia Earhart was born on the bluffs overlooking the Missouri River.

Journey through Amelia's adventurous life as a trailblazing aviator who defied the odds to pursue her dreams!

The centerpiece of the museum is "Muriel", the last remaining Lockheed Electra 10-E, identical to the plane Amelia piloted on her fateful flight (pictured right)

Surrounding "Muriel" are 14 interactive STEM and history exhibits that take visitors through Earhart's extraordinary life.

Dr. Kathy Sullivan

Dr. Kathy Sullivan is the first woman to walk in space, a veteran of three space shuttle missions, and the former administrator of NOAA (National Oceanic and Administrative Administration). In 2020, she made a historic dive to the ocean's deepest point.



She achieved numerous accolades including being a member of the National Aviation Hall of Fame, the Woman Aviators Hall of Fame, a member of the Time Magazine 100 Most Influential People in 2014, the Astronaut Hall of Fame, the Women Divers Hall of Fame and many more.

Dr. Sullivan's experience includes the U.S. Navy Reserve, a Mission Specialist Astronaut, CEO of COSI (Center of Science and Industry), and the Lindbergh Chair in Aerospace History at the Smithsonian National Air & Space Museum.
